Clinton County District Attorney Andrew J. Wylie announced today that the Clinton County District Attorney's office and the Adirondack Drug Task Force conducted a unified law enforcement round up of seven individuals who have recently been indicted by the Clinton County Grand Jury. The following defendants were arrested this week and arraigned in Clinton County Court:

**1. Jerry L. Dapo                      Age 35                      433 Lapham Mills Rd, Peru, NY 12972**



**Jerry L. Dapo was arraigned May 9, 2013 upon an indictment charging Criminal Sale of a Controlled Substance 3<sup>rd</sup> Degree, 2 counts and Criminal Possession of a Controlled Substance 3<sup>rd</sup> Degree, 2 counts, both class B felonies. The defendant is alleged to have sold heroin and January 31, 2013 and morphine on February 4, 2013. Hon. Kevin Ryan set bail in the amount of \$50,000.00 cash or \$100,000.00 bond. Dapo's case is rescheduled for pre trial conference on June 5, 2013. If convicted, the defendant could be sentenced up to 18 years in state prison. Dapo is represented by Rebecca Fox, Esq.**

**2. Todd Desmond                      Age 45                      4 Crestview Way, Rouses Point, NY 12979**



**Todd Desmond was arraigned May 9, 2013 upon an indictment charging Criminal Sale of a Controlled Substance 3<sup>rd</sup> Degree, 2 counts, and Criminal Possession of a Controlled Substance 3<sup>rd</sup> Degree, 2 counts, both class B felonies. The defendant is alleged to have sold morphine on January 14, 2013 and January 15, 2013. Hon. Kevin Ryan set bail in the amount of \$25,000.00 cash or bond. Desmond's case is rescheduled for pre trial conference on June 4, 2013. If convicted, the defendant could be sentenced up to 18 years in state prison. Desmond is represented by Matthew Favro, Esq.**

**3. Matthew R. Gibson**

**Age 50**

**Matthew R. Gibson was arraigned upon an indictment charging Criminal Sale of a Controlled Substance 3<sup>rd</sup> Degree, 2 counts, and Criminal Possession of a Controlled Substance 3<sup>rd</sup> Degree, 2 counts, both class B felonies. The defendant is alleged to have sold morphine on February 6, 2013 and February 7, 2013. Hon. Patrick R. McGill set bail in the amount of \$50,000.00 cash or \$100,000.00 bond. Gibson's case is rescheduled for pre trial conference on June 4, 2013. If convicted, the defendant could be sentenced up to 24 years in state prison. The defendant is represented by Heather Maure, Esq**

**4. Daniel S. Miller**

**Age 21**

**Daniel S. Miller was arraigned May 8, 2013 upon an indictment charging Criminal Sale of a Controlled Substance 3<sup>rd</sup> Degree, 2 counts, and Criminal Possession of a Controlled Substance 3<sup>rd</sup> Degree, 2 counts, both class B felonies. The defendant, formerly a student at SUNY Plattsburgh, is alleged to have sold cocaine on April 3, 2013 and April 25, 2013. Additionally, at the time of his arrest, Miller was found in possession of two ounces of cocaine, one pound of marihuana, scales, and \$3,000 in cash. Hon. Patrick McGill set bail in the amount of \$10,000.00 cash or \$20,000.00 bond. Miller's case is rescheduled for pre trial conference on May 28, 2013. If convicted, the defendant could be sentenced up to 27 years in state prison. Miller is represented by Joe Mucia, Esq.**

**5. Kyle M. Perry**

**Age 21**

**Kyle M. Perry was arraigned May 8, 2013 upon an indictment charging Criminal Sale of a Controlled Substance 3<sup>rd</sup> Degree, 2 counts, and Criminal Possession of a Controlled Substance 3<sup>rd</sup> Degree, 2 counts, both class B felonies. The defendant, a student at SUNY Plattsburgh, is alleged to have sold cocaine on February 13, 2013 and February 25, 2013. Perry's release is pending approval of the Clinton County Pre-trial Release Program. Perry's case is rescheduled for pre trial conference on May 28, 2013. If convicted, the defendant could be sentenced up to 18 years in state prison. Perry is represented by Joe Mucia, Esq.**

**6. Kevin J. Quigley**

**Age 21**

**Kevin J. Quigley was arraigned May 8, 2013 upon an indictment charging Criminal Sale of a Controlled Substance 3<sup>rd</sup> Degree, 2 counts, and Criminal Possession of a Controlled Substance 3<sup>rd</sup> Degree, 2 counts, both class B felonies. The defendant, a student at SUNY Plattsburgh, is alleged to have sold heroin on January 30, 2013 and February 6, 2013. Hon. Patrick McGill set bail in the amount of \$10,000.00 cash or \$20,000.00 bond. Quigley's case is rescheduled for pre trial conference on May 31, 2013. If convicted, the defendant could be sentenced up to 18 years in state prison. Quigley is represented by Joe Mucia, Esq.**

**7. Cory R. Seymour**

**Age 29**

**Cory R. Seymour was arraigned May 8, 2013 upon an indictment charging Criminal Sale of a Controlled Substance 3<sup>rd</sup> Degree, 2 counts, and Criminal Possession of a Controlled Substance 3<sup>rd</sup> Degree, 2 counts, both class B felonies. The defendant is alleged to have sold heroin on February 7, 2013 and February 15, 2013. Hon. Patrick McGill set bail in the amount of \$25,000.00 cash or \$50,000.00 bond. Seymour's case is rescheduled for pre trial conference on May 28, 2013. If convicted, the defendant could be sentenced up to 24 years in state prison. Seymour is represented by Joe Mucia, Esq.**

The cases will be prosecuted by Assistant District Attorney Douglas Collyer.

All cases were the result of a investigations conducted by the Adirondack Drug Task Force which consists of the Plattsburgh City Police Department, Drug Enforcement Administration, U.S. Border Patrol, New York State Police, Clinton County Sheriff's Department and the Clinton County District Attorney's Office and the New York State Police Troop B Narcotics Task Force.

All defendants are presumed innocent until proven guilty beyond a reasonable doubt.
