

### REYNOLDS SENTENCED TO 25 YEARS TO LIFE

April 27, 2009

Plattsburgh, N.Y. Clinton County District Attorney Andrew J. Wylie announced today that defendant **Joseph Reynolds**, dob: 7/11/76, appeared before the Hon. Timothy J. Lawliss today in the Integrated



Domestic Violence Part of the Clinton County Supreme Court for sentencing following his February 27, 2009 conviction for the class A-II felony offense of Predatory Sexual Assault Against a Child, the class B felony offense of Course of Sexual Conduct Against a Child, and Endangering the Welfare of a Child, a class A

misdemeanor offense.

Assistant District Attorney Chantelle Schember, who prosecuted handled the case since its inception, requested the court on behalf of the District Attorney's office to sentence the defendant to 25 years to Life, the maximum term of imprisonment allowable under the law. The Court granted the People's request and sentenced the defendant to an indeterminate sentence of 25 years to Life for the Predatory Sexual Assault Against a Child conviction; a determinate sentence of 25 years for the Course of Sexual Conduct Against a Child conviction; and 1 year on the Endangering conviction. As is required by law, each of the imposed sentences will run concurrent with each other. District Attorney Wylie indicated that he was very pleased with the sentencing outcome and advised that his office will continue to prosecute cases of this nature to the fullest extent of the law.
